End of The Great War

- USA enters the war in April 1917, angered by German submarine attacks against neutral Ships
- * Germans make final push, taking back Ypres, Somme & Passch
- Germany running low on troops, food, and supplies
- During final 3 months of war, Canada's troops very successful due to disciplined command of Arthur Currie
- November 9, 1918: German Kaiser abdicated
- November 11, 1918: Armistice signed at 11:00 a.m. in France
- Canadian Private George Price is the last soldier to die on the Western Front - a sniper shoots him just before 11:00

Paris Peace Conference



- January, 1919: Delegates from 27 nations meet in Paris to discuss peace terms
 - Borden fights for independent Canadian seat at the Paris Peace Conference (rather than British representation)
 - American President Woodrow Wilson proposes 14-point plan for peace
 - France and Britain want Germany to **pay** for war

Treaty of Versailles


Signed June 28, 1919 with 440 clauses:

- Germany must accept "War Guilt Clause" *
- Germany must pay \$30 billion in reparations *
- * Map of Europe redrawn (Germany loses territory)
- * German army restricted to 100,000 soldiers with no U-Boats or air force

Canada also signs Treaty of Versailles, independently *Obviously, Germany was unhappy with agreement*




Territory Lost by Germany
