
# The Indian Act, 1876

# "Status Indian"

#### **Negative consequences:**

- Not "people," denied certain rights
- Forbidden from buying alcohol
- Could not vote
- Could not own land or buy ammunition
- Women denied status
- Renamed individuals with European names
- Forbidden from speaking native language
- Forbidden from practicing religion or cultural ceremonies
- Reserves: had to have a pass to leave or sell any farm products

# Giving up "Status"

- (+) Become "person" by voluntary enfranchisement
- (+) Same rights as other Canadians
- (-) Meant cutting themselves off from their reserve communities, culture, etc.

### Reserves



#### THIS IS AN INDIAN RESERVE

Any person who trespasses on an Indian Reserve is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month, or to both fine and imprisonment.

**DIRECTOR OF INDIAN AFFAIRS** 

Department of Citizenship and Immigration, Indian Affairs Branch, OTTAWA.

- Land set aside for the use of Status Indians
- Property of the Government
- Had to give up traditional territories
- Had to have a pass to leave
- Meant to be temporary
- Often very poor land for farming

### Local Government

- Indian Act set out structure of local gov't
- Ignored traditional forms of government
- Replaced with "town council" model
- Band Council led by Chief Councillor
- Imposed system created disruption in society

- Minister of Indian Affairs still has legal ability to interfere in many aspects of First Nations' lives
- Act does give some benefits... BUT they are outweighed by discrimination & oppression embedded in it.
