

Unit Project: Paragraphs

Description:

You will write a minimum of two paragraphs to address the following prompt:

Using examples from the texts we have studied in class, describe what the cost of war is.

ELOs:

- ✓ I can organize my writing into paragraphs
- ✓ I can write a topic sentence/main idea
- ✓ I can write at least three supporting details (per paragraph)
- ✓ I can write a strong concluding sentence
- ✓ I can use transition words to connect my thoughts
- ✓ I can add a variety of different sentence lengths for fluency
- ✓ I can use proper conventions in my writing
- ✓ I can produce a final product
- ✓ I can edit my own work and the work of my peers



Steps:

- Brainstorm**
Use your Cost of War chart. Think of the impacts (e.g. war impacts soldiers negatively) and then some evidence from a text (e.g. in the article _____, the former soldier talks about suicide, PTSD, etc.).
- Create an outline**
Organize your ideas and thoughts by creating an outline. Remember that each paragraph needs to have a main idea and at least three supporting details. You can use your own format for an outline, or the attached graphic organizer.
- Review the CRITERIA** before you write
*The attached rubric has details about **what you need to include** and **what you will be marked on**. Make sure that you review this before you start writing!*
- Write your paragraphs**
Your rough draft can either be written by hand OR typed. Your final product (after peer and self-editing) should be TYPED, 1.5 OR DOUBLE SPACED, with a TITLE and proper paragraph format.
- Peer Evaluation, Self-Edit**
Have 2 classmates fill out the attached peer evaluation forms. Use their feedback to complete final edits of your work. When finished, make sure you use the criteria page to check and self-assess your work.

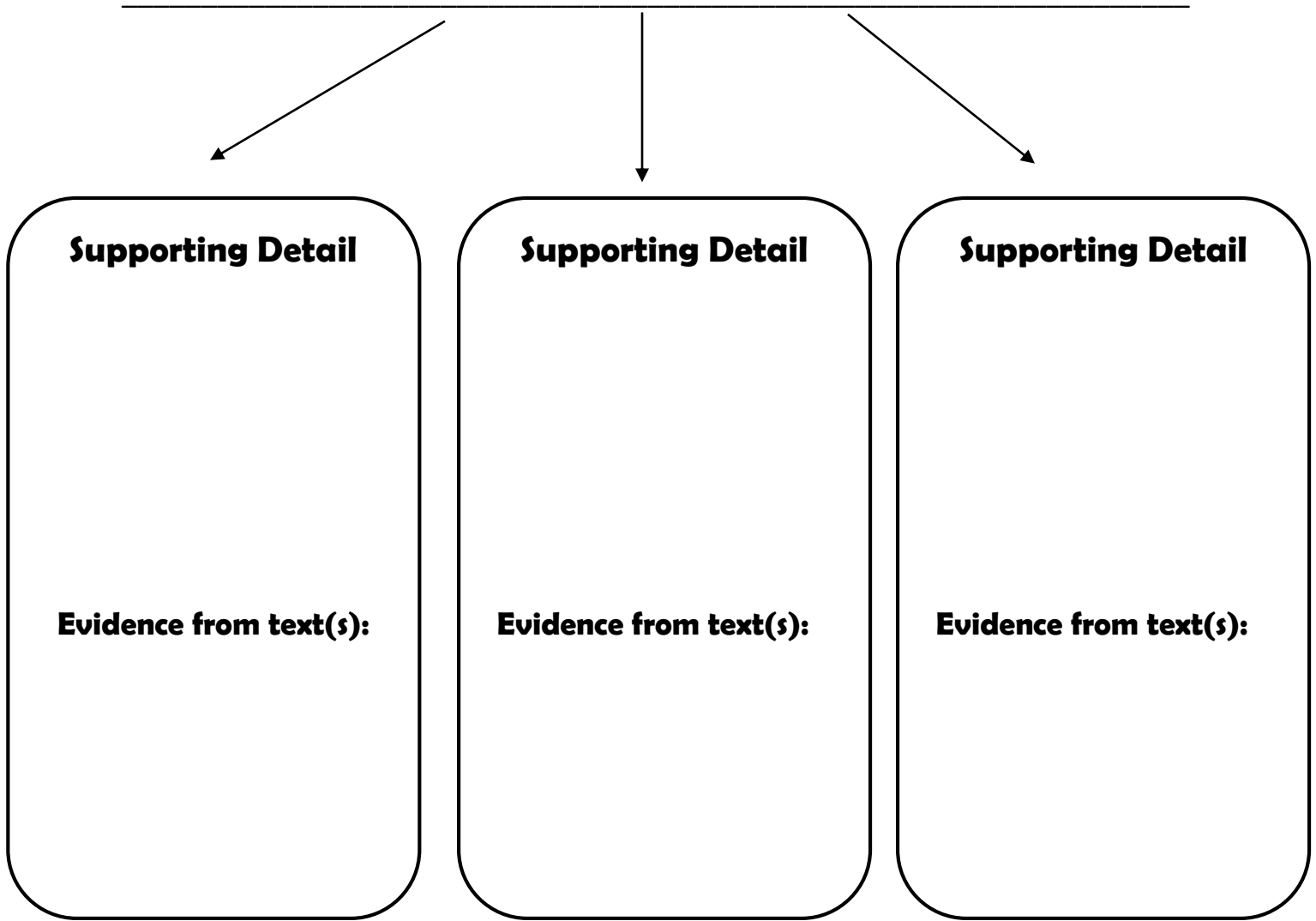
