

A Road Trip Anywhere in Canada!

<u>Theme</u>

The trip must have a major theme. For example, golf trip, ski trip, visit national parks, fishing, sightseeing, camping, etc. Explain why you chose the theme and what you expect to gain from the trip.

<u>Criteria</u>

- □ Introduction: what kind of vehicle are you driving on your road trip and who is with you? What are your start and end points? Approximately how many days will the road trip take?
- □ The trip has to be over 1000 km in length and without any long stretches of backtracking
- Detailed maps of your route will be submitted (can use Google Maps + snipping tool for this)
- □ List all provinces, towns, and cities you will pass through and indicate them on the maps
- □ Give a full description of 10 towns/cities which you will pass through and state the population, and the two major industries of each town
- □ List all <u>historical sites (minimum 5 sites)</u> that you will pass through; this includes <u>national parks</u>, <u>famous</u> <u>landforms</u>, etc. Explain the importance of each site.
- UNESCO World Heritage Sites: your trip must include a visit to at least ONE. Include a description/photos/video.
- □ List and describe all provincial/private campsites OR hotels you will be staying at.
- □ State the <u>climate of the regions</u> you will be travelling through
- Give the GPS coordinates (longitude and latitude) of your starting point and final destination
- □ List the <u>landform regions</u> that you will travel through and give a brief description of each (e.g. Canadian Shield, Prairies, etc.)
- □ Choose at least 3 songs that represent different parts of your road trip, and explain why those songs fit the areas you are traveling through.

Consider keeping track of your journey using Google Maps

Presentation

- The project can be displayed on poster board, Prezi, PowerPoint.
- There must be a written component, describing the trip (journal entries) that include why you have decided to go to the places you have chosen.

- Also included in the written description of the cities: the population; the top two industries & why the city came to be
- Historical and physical landform sites must be identified on the map as well as in the paper
- State why the sites are historical and why the landforms are unique
- Try to include lots of photos. If you are making a PowerPoint/Prezi, videos would also be great!
