Run-On Sentences

A RUN-ON SENTENCE is two or more complete sentences written without proper punctuation between them.

Run-Ons:

Soccer is exhausting work, you have to be in great shape to be a soccer player.

It looks easy it's really hard.

It's beautiful, though, soccer is my favorite sport.

RUN-ONS can be corrected in three ways;

1. If the two sentences are closely related, they can be separated by a semi-colon.

Correct: Soccer is exhausting work; you have to be in great shape to be a soccer player.

2. Closely related sentences can also be separated with a comma and a conjunction.

Correct: It looks easy, but it's really hard.

3. Sentences that are not as closely related can be separated with a period.

Correct: It's beautiful, though. Soccer is my favorite sport.
