 People look to the past to find answers to current problems. Events from the past can offer solutions. We can learn from mistakes as well as triumphs.






Evidence is found in a variety of SOURCES Literary/non-literary




A <u>PRIMARY</u> source is something that was written, said or made <u>AT THE</u> <u>TIME</u> of the event by someone who <u>HAS EXPERIENCED</u> it.

A <u>SECONDARY</u> source is something that has been written, said or made <u>LATER</u>, by someone who has <u>NOT EXPERIENCED</u> the event.
