
Who Should Be The 1st Woman On Our Currency?

Select ONE candidate for special recognition as the 1st Canadian female recognized on our Currency
This candidate will also have a list of accomplishments detailed plus a short essay that argues why
she is MOST deserving of this special honour. (Use at least THREE arguments to support your case!
